GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the Medical Review Board has reported to the NYS Commission of Correction pursuant to Correction Law, section 47(1)(d), regarding the death of James Campbell who died on November 10, 2021 , as a result of circumstances which occurred while an incarcerated individual in the custody of the Nassau County Sheriff at the Nassau County Jail, the Commission has determined that the following final report be issued.

FINDINGS:

1. James Campbell was a 57-year-old male who died on 11/10/21 due to gastrointestinal hemorrhage due to penetrating chronic peptic ulcer of duodenum while in the custody of the Nassau County Sheriff at the Nassau County Jail.
