## GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, the Medical Review Board has reported to the NYS Commission of Correction pursuant to Correction Law, section 47(1)(d), regarding the death of Saul Angulo who died on September 1, 2020, while an incarcerated individual in the custody of the NYS Department of Corrections and Community Supervision at the Green Haven Correctional Facility, the Commission has determined that the following preliminary report be issued.

FINDINGS:


1. Saul Angulo was a 46-year-old male who died on 9/1/2020 from an Acute Fentanyl Intoxication while in the custody of the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (NYS DOCCS) at the Green Haven Correctional Facility (CF).
2. In January 1995, Angulo, in concert with two individuals, armed with a knife & a shotgun, brutally murdered six victims and slashed the throat of a seventh victim. One of the murdered female victims was five months pregnant. The seventh victim sustained a gunshot to her face and serious injuries to her throat. She was hospitalized for several weeks at a New York hospital. Angulo denied his guilt in the instant offense, and he claimed that the witness against him was lying. Angulo was convicted of Murder 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree, Attempted Murder 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree, Robbery 1<sup>st</sup> Degree, and Criminal Possession Weapon 2<sup>nd</sup> Degree and was sentenced to life in prison.

4. On 12/19/95, Angulo was received in NYS DOCCS. On 5/12/15, Angulo was transferred to Green Haven CF.

7. On 9/1/20 at approximately 8:40 p.m., another incarcerated individual reported to Correction Officer (CO) T.T that Angulo appeared to be slumped over in his cell. CO A.B. responded to the cell and found Angulo unresponsive in his cell. CO A.B. called a medical response. CO A.B. administered one dose of Narcan without effect. CO A.B. delivered a second dose without effect and initiated CPR. The AED was applied without shock indicated. Medical staff Registered Nurse (RN) D.B. arrived [REDACTED] [REDACTED] EMS was activated. [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. At 9:14 pm., Em Star EMS arrived, [REDACTED] [REDACTED]
8. The investigation conducted by the DOCCS Office of Special Investigation found no violations of department directives by department staff. There were no specific findings regarding the source of the contraband drugs. A review of the medical record revealed

that the Non-Specific Patient Standing Order form for Narcan was expired, however this was noted and addressed at the facility mortality review.

ACTIONS REQUIRED:

This case be closed as an accidental overdose.
