Located on Rikers Island in East Elmhurst, New York, the West Facility opened in 1978. The current Maximum Facility Capacity is rated at 1905 beds at standard, consisting of 36 individual occupancy housing areas and 24 multiple occupancy housing areas for both general housing and special housing.

The facility is led by an Assistant Commissioner and is operated by a compliment of sworn security and civilian personnel. Those staff are responsible for providing all required essential services to incarcerated individuals while maintaining the safety and security of the facility.

NOTE: INDIVIDUAL OCCUPANCY HOUSING UNITS AND MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY HOUSING UNITS WHICH MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS PURSUANT TO 9 NYCRR PART 7040 ARE TO BE INCLUDED IN THE MAXIMUM FACILITY CAPACITY FORMULATION.

I. INDIVIDUAL OCCUPANCY HOUSING UNITS:

1. Each such unit shall only house one (1) incarcerated individual and contain at least 60 square feet of floor space.
2. Each such individual occupancy housing unit shall contain:
 - One (1) bed and mattress;
 - One (1) functioning toilet; and
 - One (1) functioning sink.
3. Sufficient showers shall be available to permit each incarcerated individual to shower daily.
4. Each tier or section of individual housing units constructed after the effective date of 9 NYCRR 7040 shall provide dayroom space adjacent and accessible to such tier or section.

EXCEPTIONS:

1. A unit may contain less than 60 square feet of floor space if such unit was originally constructed for single occupancy prior to the effective date of 9 NYCRR Part 7040.
2. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

II. MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY HOUSING UNITS:

1. Each such unit shall provide a minimum of 50 square feet of floor space per incarcerated individual in the sleeping area.
2. Each such unit shall house no more than 60 incarcerated individuals.
3. Each such unit shall have a bed and mattress for each incarcerated individual.
4. Each such unit shall have at least:
 - One (1) functioning toilet for every 12 incarcerated individuals;
 - One (1) functioning shower for every 15 incarcerated individuals; and
 - One (1) functioning sink for every 12 incarcerated individuals.
5. Each such unit shall provide a minimum of 25 square feet of dayroom space immediately adjacent and accessible to the sleeping area.

EXCEPTIONS:

1. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

III. UNITS CONTAINING BOTH INDIVIDUAL AND MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY HOUSING:

1. The requirements as stipulated in I and II apply to all housing units consisting of both individual and multiple occupancy housing units.

EXCEPTIONS:

1. A unit may contain less than 60 square feet of floor space if such unit was originally constructed for single occupancy prior to the effective date of 9 NYCRR Part 7040.
2. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

IV. NON-HOUSING AREAS USED FOR THE TEMPORARY DETENTION OF INDIVIDUALS

1. These are used to identify areas within the facility that are used for the temporary detention of individuals. These areas do not increase the capacity of the facility.

West Facility

Located on Rikers Island in East Elmhurst, New York, the West Facility opened in 1991. The current Maximum Facility Capacity is rated at 698 beds at standard, consisting of 7 individual occupancy housing areas and 12 multiple occupancy housing areas for both general housing and special housing.

The facility is led by an Assistant Commissioner and is operated by a compliment of sworn security and civilian personnel. Those staff are responsible for providing all required essential services to incarcerated individuals while maintaining the safety and security of the facility.

 - One (1) functioning shower for every 15 incarcerated individuals; and
 - One (1) functioning sink for every 12 incarcerated individuals.
5. Each such unit shall provide a minimum of 25 square feet of dayroom space immediately adjacent and accessible to the sleeping area.

EXCEPTIONS:

1. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

GREETINGS:

The New York State Commission of Correction (Commission), having learned, upon information and belief, that the New York City Department of Correction (Department), at the Eric M. Taylor Center, George R. Vierno Center, North Infirmery Command, Rose M. Singer Center and West Facility, has commenced or completed renovation or improvement projects at these facilities without prior Commission review and approval, has determined that the Department has violated, or is about to violate, the following statutes and minimum standard regulations relating to the construction, management and affairs of a local correctional facility:

Correction Law §45(10)

The Commission shall have the following functions, powers and duties: Approve or reject plans and specifications for the construction or improvement of correctional facilities that directly affect the health of incarcerated individuals and staff, safety, or security.

9 NYCRR §7001.1(a)

Correction Law, section 45, subdivision 10, requires that any plans and specifications for the construction or renovation of detention facilities must be

submitted for review to the State Commission of Correction.

9 NYCRR §7001.1(b)

Approval of the commission must be obtained before a construction or renovation project is advertised for bids. If it is not contemplated that a bidding procedure is to be followed, approval must be obtained before any construction or renovation is undertaken.

The New York City Department of Correction at the Eric M. Taylor Center, George R. Vierno Center, North Infirmiry Command, Rose M. Singer Center, and West Facility is violating, or about to violate, the above statute and minimum standard regulations, in that it has commenced or completed the following renovation and improvement projects, notwithstanding the fact that the Department has not, as of the date of this Directive, obtained project approval from the Commission:

Eric M. Taylor Center (EMTC): Completed renovations to the facility's gymnasium, converting it to a contact visitation area.

George R. Vierno Center (GRVC): Completed renovations in housing area 11B that were inconsistent with the plans and specification submitted to the Commission and approved. Additionally, commenced renovations in housing areas 13A, 15A and 15B that were inconsistent with the plans and specification submitted to the Commission and approved.

North Infirmiry Command (NIC): Completed renovations in housing area 3D, converting an individual occupancy unit into two (2) shower stalls.

Rose M. Singer Center (RMSC): Completed renovations in housing area 9 that were inconsistent with the plans and specification submitted to the Commission and approved.

West Facility (West): Completed renovations of a sprung that is labeled "Chapel."

WHEREAS, the State Commission of Correction is an independent body charged by its constitutional and statutory mandates with oversight and regulatory responsibility for all State and local correctional facilities within New York State; and

WHEREAS, New York City Commissioner of Correction Louis A. Molina, pursuant to section 500-c(2) of the Correction Law, has been charged with the custody and control of the local correctional facilities within the City of New York, to include AMKC, EMTC, GRVC, NIC, OBCC, RMSC, RNDC, VCBC and West; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to subdivision (4) of section 46 of the Correction Law, in any case where a minimum standard regulation or statute relating to the construction, management and affairs of a local correctional facility, and the care, treatment and discipline of its incarcerated individuals is being or is about to be violated, the State Commission of Correction shall notify the person in control of the facility, recommend remedial action, and direct such person to comply with the statute, rule or regulation; and

WHEREAS, the New York City Commissioner of Correction, upon information and belief,

is violating, or is about to violate, the above minimum standard regulations relating to the construction, management and affairs of a local correctional facility, and the care, treatment and discipline of its incarcerated individuals; it is hereby

RECOMMENDED, that the New York City Commissioner of Correction undertake remedial action to ensure that no construction or renovation is undertaken to any local correctional of the Department without the prior review and approval of the New York State Commission of Correction; and you are hereby

ORDERED AND DIRECTED to refrain from undertaking any construction or renovation of the New York City Department of Correction facilities or cause such construction or renovation to be undertaken without the prior review and approval of the New York State Commission of Correction; and you are further

ORDERED AND DIRECTED to submit to the State Commission of Correction, within ten (10) days of the date of this **DIRECTIVE**, documentation substantiating compliance with this **DIRECTIVE**.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE, that non-compliance with this **DIRECTIVE** may result in an application by the State Commission of Correction to the Supreme Court of the State of New York for an order directing compliance.
